The "Rex" Hockey Sticks.

Our latest pattern, made of straight selected second-growth yellow birch. For expert players—forwards, defence and goal. The features which recommend it are:—1st—Longitudinal serrations on handle, ensuring firm grip and preventing stick slipping from players' hands. 2nd—Double grooved blade, the lower one also being serrated. This enables the puck to be accurately shot for goal and strengthens the stick at its weakest point. Ask for the "Rex" stick.
