## "Germany is Beaten"

New York World: In spite of what  
has happened in Russia and Italy,  
Germany is beaten. The Russian  
counter-revolution and the Italian  
collapse may prolong the resistance  
of the German peoples by renewing  
the hope of a favorable peace, but  
Germany is as surely beaten as the  
Southern Confederacy was in 1864,  
when Early's troops camped in sight  
of Washington and could have seized  
the capital. The United States will  
unquestionably be obliged to increase  
its efforts. The American people  
must abandon the notion that the war  
will be won for them by Russians and  
Italians, or that anybody can do for  
them what they must do for them-  
selves. But Germany, nevertheless,  
will be beaten, and the victory will be  
won by France, Great Britain and the  
United States, whatever happens in  
Russia, whatever happens to Italy  
and whatever happens to any other  
country that is at war with Prussian-  
ism.
