The proceeds of the recent Methodist entertainment at West Lorne amounted to \$26. The flowing wells on the farm of Squire Davis, of Orwell, are a boon to the community. The Southampton furniture factory will be offered for sale under mortgage on Monday, Aug. 15. Mr. Nelson, one of the earliest settlers of Houghton, died recently at his home near Houghton Center. The treasurer's sale of lands for taxes in the county of Grey takes place at Owen Sound on Nov. 6. J. McCready, of Simcoe, has been placed in charge of the Tilsonburg junction of the B. & T. Baird, of Pickering, had his arm severely crushed by getting it caught in the shafting of an engine.
