New York, Dec. 25.—Joseph F. Donoghue, of Newburgh, the champion amateur skater of the world, has made a deposit with authority to publish over his name a challenge to skate any man in the world, on ice, on a series of races, one, three or five miles, for the championship of the world. Each race is to be for a purse of from \$1,500 to \$2,500. He will increase the number of races and will accommodate to any size purse, but for none less than \$1,000.

**BURNED OUT.**  
The C. P. R. Vice President's Home Badly Damaged—Destruction of a Church at Burlington.

MONTREAL, Dec. 25.—The residence of T. G. Sheehy, vice-president, and general manager of the C. P. R., on Dorchester street west, caught fire early this morning and was badly damaged. The family had only returned from a trip abroad last evening and were awakened about 7 o'clock by smoke, when it was found the lower floor was in flames. A large quantity of valuable furniture was destroyed. The damage is estimated at from \$10,000 to \$15,000.

BURLINGTON, Dec. 25.—Shortly after 12 this afternoon fire was discovered in the school room of the Methodist Church in this village, and in spite of every effort the school room and church were destroyed. The pipe organ, all the church furniture and the Sunday school library were saved. It was with difficulty the hall and adjacent building were saved, there being no fire brigade or engine in the village, and the water had to be carried from a small creek 500 yards distant. The house of Rev. Dr. Brethour, pastor of the church, had a very narrow escape. Lost about \$1,200; insured for \$9,000.

NEWARK, N. J., Dec. 25.—St. Augustine's Roman Catholic Church was burned this morning, causing a loss of \$15,000. The fire was caused by the heating apparatus.

**A Millionaire's Daughter Steals.**  
St. Louis, Mo., Dec. 25.—Eugenia Daucher, daughter of Millionaire W. V. Daucher, was arrested Thursday evening for shoplifting at five places, spent the night at the third district police station.

Miss Daucher is 26 years old, pretty and accomplished. She was overcome with grief and shame, but sent for her father, who is 75 years old. When he reached the cell door he broke down and had to be carried to his chair by a nurse.

**The Economic Society Loses Its Leader.**  
TIRRENTINO, Pa., Dec. 25.—Jacob Henrich, senior partner of the Economic Society, of Economy, Pa., died today, aged 58 years. The society, of which Father Henrich was leader, is composed of about 800 people, who are worth between \$5,000,000 and \$10,000,000. They make up the town of Economy, about 30 miles west of Pittsburgh. The Economic Society made all their money by farming.

## Late Canadian News

Latest Developments in the Leamington Lottery Business—A Kingston Convict's Terrible Fall.

Mrs. Gladstone's name is on the voters' list at Niagara Falls.

Mr. J. G. Frost has been elected president of the Reform Club of Belleville. The Geological Society of America meets in Ottawa Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

A Winnipeg dispatch says there has been a very heavy snowstorm in the Territories and trains are delayed.

It is understood to be definitely settled that Hon. Wilfrid Laurier will attend the Toronto Board of Trade banquet.

It is reported that Geo. Vickers, agent for musical instrument at Mitchell, has left there; his present residence is not known.

Michael Curran, a laborer, was killed by the premature explosion of a dynamite blast while working in a drain at Ottawa on Saturday.

A Toronto evening paper announces that Dalton McCarthy has decided to leave the Conservative party and strike out on independent lines.

Joseph Morris, an Indian, aged 40, was found in Yukon, Brook road, near Kenville, N.S., on Friday, frozen to death. The combination of whiskey and Jack Frost was too much for him.

Mr. John McFec, Belleville, has discovered in the township of Berke, Prescott, a vein of silver lead, which is 15 feet in width and gave an average of 72 ounces of silver to the ton.

In May last E. B. Zealand went from St. Thomas to Bowmanville and lunched into the jewelry business at the latter place, but not being able to obtain sufficient patronage he has resigned.

The Brockville firm of contractors, of which Mr. Taylor is the head, has been notified that their tender for section of the Soulages canal had been accepted.

It is understood at Ottawa that the Canadian Pacific Railroad has come to a definite understanding with the Government in the matter of placing a line of fast steamers on the Pacific Ocean service, and that the line will be in operation in 1902.

In regard to the recent lottery at Leamington it transpires that of 55 horses put up, Wigle drew 43. Three go to Amherstburg, 1 to Cleveland, 1 to Kingsville and the rest to other places outside. None of the horses were drawn in Windsor, where a large number of tickets were sold.

A convict named Bruce, while at work on the roof of a building in the Kingston penitentiary, fell to the ground, a distance of 65 feet, shattering both his arms so badly that they will have to be amputated. He has been in penitentiary only a few weeks, but this is his fifth term in prison.

James Collins, Alex. Leslie and wife left Northport Saturday morning with a team of horses before a sleigh, by way of the ice, en route for Belleville. Upon returning home the sleigh and the team were found to be missing. The horses were drowned, the total loss being \$375.

A Comber dispatch says a man named Labonte—a Frenchman—fired two shots on Thursday, on a main street, at Paris and Geo. Hillman for \$125, and the other on Jos. Duquette and Jos. Tibbott for \$50. Dr. Anderson, a resident physician, cashed the notes, the consideration being \$90. Labonte spent the money freely around the town and disappeared. The notes have been found to be forgeries, and detectives have been notified.

**Idle Talk.**  
WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 24.—The subject of war vessels on the great lakes continues to be discussed in diplomatic and navy circles. The talk, however, is all unofficial. If the State Department considers that Great Britain has violated treaty stipulations in the construction of three Canadian revenue cutters, it has not yet so stated nor has it in any way protested to the British Government.
