

PARIS PRESENTATION OF NEW WINTER FASHIONS

BIG STOCK BARN DESTROYED BY FIRE

**Loss of J. L. Englehart, at
Petrolea, Will Reach
Fully \$10,000.**

The cause of the fire is unknown. The burned building was one of the most up-to-date barns in Western Ontario. It had been enlarged and rebuilt during the summer of 1910, at a cost of over \$5,000. The basement walls were of brick and stone. The floors, mangers and partitions of concrete and iron, and the whole was fitted up with all the most modern ap-

A Mass of Flames.

The fire was discovered about nine o'clock. Two men were at work in the stables at the time and no one had been in the upper part of the building since the evening before.

Robert Droupe, who has charge of the barn, had occasion to go upstairs and found the interior a mass of flames. About the same time the alarm was given from the outside. The thirty head of thoroughbred stock, worth from \$100 or \$300 each, were saved with difficulty. Droupe was overcome with smoke, but was dragged out in time to save his life.

The Petrolia fire brigade was sent for and one engine and a hose wagon were sent out. These arrived in time to save a large horse stable about 75 feet to the south of the main building.

A high wind carried the names away from the dwelling house, which stood about 150 feet to the west of the barn. The loss will reach \$10,000, and is partly covered by insurance. In the barn were 75 tons of hay, 2,000 bushels of grain, and supplies for the winter. Mr. Enslahert is in Toronto.
