RELIEF CAR FOR BELGIAN BABIES LEAVES FEB. 20

Especially Urgent Appeal From Relief Committee of Women's Canadian Club.

An especially urgent appeal from the relief committee of the Women's Canadian Club is made for donations of clothing, also money to purchase foodstuffs, for the destitute Belgians.

Bales of clothing should be packed in wooden boxes, if possible, and sent to the C. E. R. freight sheds, London, marked, "For Belgian Relief." Money donations may be sent to Mrs. A. T. Edwards, the treasurer, 183 Oxford street.

Mrs. Edwards has received a donation of \$11 from the Women's Association of Knox Church, South London, four pieces of beautifully handpainted china, to be sold for Belgian relief, from Mrs. Cummings, Wilson avenue and from a little 5-year-old boy, yesterday afternoon, three yards of pennies, \$1.08, for the children's car.
