In abolishing the election of councilmen from wards and in substituting a small legislative body, Seattle is following the city of Boston and adopting a modified commission form of government. Eighteen candidates' names will be on the ballot tomorrow, and each elector may vote for nine. An elimination primary, held two weeks ago, weeded out the forty candidates who received the smallest vote.


