BARRISTER HANDS' FATE. The Court of Appeal Hands Down Judg-mont Against Him, but Passes Shrie-inges on His Trial Below.

The Court of Appeal yesterday gave judg-ment in the now famous case of Hands v. the Law Society, an action brought by Mr. J. Baldwin Hands, barrister, of this city, to restrain the Law Society from proceeding to disbar him for unprofessional conduct. The Court of Appeal allows the appeal of the Law Society from the judgment of the Queen's Bench Divisional Court and affirms the judg-ment of Chancellor Boyd, which sustained the action of the Benchers and refused to interfere with their decision. The offence charged against Mr. Hands was that of having misappropriated certain noneys of his client, Miss Jemina Craine, of St. Catharines. The matter was brought be-fore the Sanhedrim of the Ontario Bar, the Discipline Committee of the Law Society, and this body, acting on unsworn evidence, sentenced Mr. Hands to professional execu-tion, viz., to be disbarred and to be struck off the rolls as a solicitor. Mr. Hands then brought the present ac-tion on the ground that the proceedings before the committee were irregular, the without the sanctity or legal responsibility of an eath and that the notice calling the meeting was not sufficient. The Chancellor dismissed the sotion, but on Mr. Hands' appeal to the Queen's Bench Divisional Court this de siston was overruled, the court holding that the proceedings of the committee were irregular. Mr. Justice Osler of the Court of Appeal upholds the judgment of the Divisional Court as to the question of the evidence being re-quired by statute to be sworn testimony and expressed his disapproval of the manner in which the evidence was taken. Chief Justice Hagarty express d the opinion that some new method of dealing with matters of this kind should be provided, and initimat-sof the scienter of the court gave judgment in favor of the appeal, so that the dccree of the Benches will take effect and Mr. Hande' if as a member of the Law Society be snuff-ed ut.
