REGOGNIZED STANDARD BRANDS Special Precautions to Be Observed This Year-Asiatic Cholera. Dr. Norman Allen, Medical Health Officer,

Dr. Norman Allen, Medical Health Officer, has written a comprehensive communication to Mr. James L. Hughes instructing 'the in-spector as to the methods to be pursued in combating the various infectious diseases. The most serious of these are diphtheria and typhoid fever, and it is a well-known fact that these at once uncrease in the city when the public schools reopen after the summer vacation.
