### SYDNEY MACNEIL LOST HIS JOB

Dismissal of Employee Who Caused Strike at Sydney is Confirmed.

Sydney.—The discharge of Sydney MacNeil, which caused the steel strike here last week, has been confirmed in a statement handed down by General Superintendent W. H. Bischoff, of Besco.

By the terms settlement, the affair was to be investigated, and if MacNeil was found guilty he was to be discharged, if exonerated he was to be reinstated. After an investigation lasting two days, Mr. Bischoff finds as follows:

"After carefully considering the evidence given in connection with the investigation of the dismissal of Sydney MacNeil, I have come to the conclusion that the Superintendent was justified in discharging him on Tuesday, February 12th. It is, per-

haps, needless to give in detail the various reasons which justified MacNeil's dismissal. His conduct was insubordinate to such a degree as to render his immediate dismissal unavoidable. It is sufficient for me to state that MacNeil willfully and improperly disobeyed the lawful and reasonable orders of his superintendent, that he ceased work without any good and sufficient reason, that he improperly stopped his machine without any orders from his foreman or superintendent, and without other sufficient excuse, and that he won about the shop advising other workmen to quit work. I also think that the evidence justifies me in concluding that MacNeil used offensive and insulting language to his superintendent. I confirm MacNeil's discharge."

### NEW SOMERVILLE LAWYER

Robie E. Kempton is to be Admitted to Bar March 16th.

Robie E. Kempton, of 191 Love's Street, Somerville, has been notified by the Bar Examiners that he has qualified as an attorney, and will be admitted to the bar March 16th.

Mr. Kempton was educated in the grammar and high schools of Nova Scotia, and later attended the Ontario Business College at Belleville, Ont. Afterwards he came to Cambridge, Mass., and became a conductor for the Boston Elevated Railway Company. From the cars he was promoted to the Claim Department of the road, where he remained for nine years. He was the youngest court assistant ever assigned to their trial counsel by the "L." He assisted F. J. W. Fostick, W. G. Thompson, F. J. Carney, W. R. Evans, Walter Shuebruk, H. D. McClellan, P. F. Drew, and others of the legal staff.

In September, 1918, Mr. Kempton resigned from the "L." Claim Department to take a position with the Fidelity and Casualty Company, of New York, and since that time has worked as an adjuster, court assistant, and spare examiner for that company, working from their Providence, Hartford and Boston offices.

Mr. Kempton is a Republican, and a member of the Middlesex Sportsmen's Association, the Everett Gun Club, the National Rifle Association, the Commercial Travelers Association, of Utica, N. Y., and the Spring Hill Men's Club. He attended North-western University, from which he degree of L.L.B.—Somerville Journal—graduated in June, 1922, with the honor.

### OBITUARY

At one time nearly every village in Ontario had its weekly paper but the best of them have since been swept away. At one time, when living was cheap and life simple, a printer with a handpress, a few fonts of type and some strong party prejudices, would team his chattels, into a village, consult local partisans, and bring out a weekly journal that delighted the heart of the villagers and farmers who belonged to his political party, and was supposed to spread terror among political opponents even as far away as Toronto and Ottawa. The local merchants were expected to take advertising space in the local paper to help it along, and that they had no real belief in advertising was shown by the way they failed to change copy for six months at a time. But somehow or other the local paper used to struggle along, and the editor got a great deal of satisfaction out of life and the hot encounters he had with his hated contemporaries. It costs money nowadays to issue even the smallest kind of a newspaper, and the larger it is the costlier. Paper, ink, type, postage, labor, cost double what they did a few years ago, and no local paper can be expected to succeed unless every local activity pays it for the publicity which it is supposed to give all local doings. A local paper can't haul a ton along unless it secures enough income to pay for the gasoline that will keep its engine going.—(Toronto Star.)
