Springless Electric Clock. The students of the St. Louis watchpendulum is impelled by an electro oscillating type.

Under the attractive influence of the coil the armature is impelled against the pendulum, driving it forward, after which the circuit is broken, leaving the armature free to be returned turning swing. The swinging pendulum also operates the escapement lever by which the clock mechanism is advanced, so no weights or springs are

Whaling In the South Atlantic. whales is converted into oil and fertilizers, says the British colonial report from Stanley, the capital of the Falklands. Six companies fish in the waters of the south Shetlands, pursuing the whale through Pelgica strait to the icy shores of Graham Land. The 1909 season in the dependencies was a good one, but was not so remunerative around the Falklands. A station at New island, fitted with the latest machinery and lighted by electricity, was completed during the year. There were exported from the Falklands last year 4,006 tons of whale oil, worth \$221,426, against 2,929 tons, worth \$275,930, in 1908 and 2,400 tons. worth \$910,000, in 1907, which shows a wide variation in market values.

Protection of Boilers. Zinc is often used to prevent the corrosion of boilers. Its efficiency is due to the fact that any metal with a greater tendency than iron to dissolve. on which hydrogen is liberated with more difficulty than on iron, will protect the latter at the expense of the more soluble metal. The protection, however, becomes more ineffective in pure water at a distance greater than an inch. Salt or some other electrolyte will extend the zone to twenty inches
