"I see now," said Tommy thoughtfully; "it is this wonderful, unlimited love which will pervade every spirit assembled there, that will render the life in Heaven an endless joy."

"Yes," said Mr. Seton, "to know our sins forgiven, and meet our Saviour, not as an angry Judge, but as a forgiving Father, then, and then only, can we realize the fulness of His mercy and our pardon."
