FRIED BREAD .-- Cut the crust from slices of stale bread; dip them in a thin batter made of a cup of milk, two eggs and a heaping tablespoonful of flour saled slightly and fey in lard to a yellow brown. Serve hot.

BROWN BRRAD.—One-half cup of Graham flour, one cup each of tye flour and cornmeal, one cup of milk, one-half cup of molasses, one even teaspoonful of salt, one even teaspoonful of salt, one even teaspoonful of soda, one tablespoonful of lard.
