## ECCLESIASTICAL NOTES.

Tue Confirmations in Nebraska are 20 per cont. in adrance of last year.
Bisuror Bissell, of Fermont, died on Sundity, May 14 th inst., in his 79 ha ycar.

Arcimeacon Farrar is preparing a" Companion" to his "Life of Christ."

Rrv. Dr. Gailor has aceepted his election as Bishop Co-adjutor of Tenuessec.

A Co-adjutor Bishop for the Diocese of Iow: is asked for, on the ground of extent of territory,

Rev. Dr. Lawrence has aceopted the Bishopric of Massachusetts, to which he was elected in succession th Dr. Brooks.

Protests against the Welsh Suspensory Bill still continue to be formulated and meetings held in all parts of England and Wales.

A new church is to be crected in Bessingly, Eng., through the bequest of Mr. (ieorge Wright, of Bessingby Hall, at a cost of about $\pm 3.000$.

Since the consecration of Dr. Weed as Bishop, of Florida in 1886, the financial and statistical force of the diocese has increased 50 per cent.

Lord Grimthorpe and his sister, Miss Beckett Denison, have undertaken the erection of a church at Hexthorpe, near Doncaster, to cost £ 4,500 .

No Christian body in Iowa shows more public spirit or supports more chatrities in proportion to its membership than the Protestan Fpiseopal Chureh.

The Convention of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew held in Columbus, O., April 30, and May 1st,for the tro dioceses of Ohio was a great sucecss.
Tire Bishop of Guildford lately presented to the parish of Chilcomb, Winchester, a munificent gift of school buildings which will aceomodate 250 children.

It is proposed to erect in Excter cathedral a momorial to the late Bishop Horden, of Moosonee, who was a native of Exeter and educated at St. John's School.

Tue Episcopal church of Newport, R. J., is to receive a church to cost $\$ 100,000$, from Mrs . Sarah Jackson, of New Fork, in memory of her mother, the late Mre. Andrew C. Zabriskic.

Tue Bishop of Iowa reported to the Convention of his diocese lately held, an increase of the
realty as over a million dollare during his Fpiscopate, and a tharefold increase in the number of communicants, congregations and working clergy.

Sir F. S. Powell, M. P., has purchased a plot of land near Brad ford, ling. at a cost of $£ 1,000$ on which is to be orected a church and vicarage in place of the present Mission Chureh at Dickhill.

St. Bantholomew's parish, N.Y., is a vist missionary agency, and includes Swedish, Armenian, Syrian and Chinese Missions, Col. Itadley's Rescue Mission and the work at the larish House.

Joins Muntington of Cleveland, Ohio, hat added his name to the atready long list of liberal benefactors of educational institutions. More than one half of his fortune of $83,000,000$ has been bequeathed to charities and schools.

At the jubilee survice of the Chureh of England Youns Mon's Sociuty held in St. Paul's Cathedral last month there were nearly 1,000 members prosent. The service was full choral, the singing being led by choir of the lay IIelpersi Asssciation.

Propesson Matyl, of the Johns Mopkins University, Pern., las discovered the missing pieces of the eleventi tablet of the Nimrod Epic. The tablet comanes the Babylonian or mather Chaldeanaceome of the Jolage, and is thre thousand or more years old.
At St. Bardrolomow's church, New York, on the morning of Sunday, 7th May, 882,000 was received in the oflertory in response to an appeal asking for $\$ 80,000$. The Bev. Ir, (irear is the rector: In tho four and a hatif ycars of Jr. Greer's rectorship $\$ 1,035,000$ has been given for charitable and current expenses.
'The Rev. William N. Dunaell, D. I., rector' of All Saintw' Church, in TIenry street, New York City, has said: "On one side of me is a block in which the poliee say thirty-nine lanuguages and rialects are spoken. Withils four blocks is a city more foreign than any city of Enrope this side of Constantinople. I found nothing in White chapel as squalid as in my own parish."
Tuestatement has been made in some American papers that the Archbislop of Canterloury and some English Bishops have consented to contribute sermons occasionally to a Sunday newspaper. But the Journal to which they have promised these contributions is not the Sunday issue of a daily paper, but a weekly paper, the printing of which is completed on Friday night and it is sold on Saturday. It is the Lloyds Wreehly. Neuspaper, one af the most widely circulated journals in the world. It is
said to be a boter paper than it usod to bo, and as it has nover been issued on Sunday, it ought, to discontime the use of this word ind mbstitute Saturday.
