As the New Year opens the Commission can report the satisfactory solution of the tasks connected with the cease-fire, the release of prisoners of war and civilian internees and the evacuation of Vietnamese Military Units. Now that the Commissioners have established frank and friendly contact with the Government it is possible to look forward to a more fruitful period of work in 1955.
