His Excellency Dr. Shuhsi Hsu presented to His Excellency the Governor-General his Letter of Credence as Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Republic of China in a ceremony which took place at Government House today. The Chief of Protocol, Mr. Henry F. Davis, presented the Ambassador to His Excellency the Governor-General.

Mr. G.P. de T. Glazebrook, Assistant Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs, and Mr. Esmond Butler, Secretary to the Governor-General, were in attendance on the Governor-General on this occasion.

Dr. Shuhsi Hsu was born April 3, 1892, in Swatow, China. He is a graduate of Hong Kong and Columbia Universities and taught international law at Yenching University, Peiping, from 1923 to 1937. He was a member of the International Law Commission from 1948 to 1961 and a member of China's Permanent Mission to the United Nations from 1945 to 1956. He was appointed Ambassador to Peru and Bolivia in 1956. He served as a delegate to the General Assembly of the United Nations in 1958, 1960 and 1962.

Dr. Hsu is married.
