Resolved, That an humble Address be presented to His Royal Highness the Governor General, praying His Royal Highness to cause to be laid before this House, a copy of all Correspondence with and from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, or other Minister of the Imperial Government, in relation to the passage of legislation providing for uniformity in naturalization throughout the Empire, since the sittings of the Imperial Conference in June last.

Ordered, That the said Address be presented to His Royal Highness by such Members of this House as are of the King's Privy Council.

On motion of Mr. Macdonald, seconded by Mr. Maclean (Halifax),

Resolved, That an humble Address be presented to His Royal Highness the Governor General, praying His Royal Highness to cause to be laid before this House, a copy of all Papers, letters, telegrams, memoranda or correspondence of any kind had between the Dominion Government and the Governments of Manitoba and Saskatchewan, or with the Government of Ontario, as to the settlement of the boundaries of said respective Provinces; also, of any agreement or memo containing any terms of settlement of the questions relating to the boundaries of said Provinces or any part thereof; and also, of any documents, letters or representations made to the Federal Government by any person or persons relative to said settlement or the questions involved therein.

Ordered, That the said Address be presented to His Royal Highness by such Members of this House as are of the King's Privy Council.

On motion of Mr. Maclean (Halifax), seconded by Mr. Macdonald,

Ordered, That there be laid before this House a copy of all Agreements between the Minister of Railways of Canada and any of the Brotherhood Unions or organizations of the employees of the Intercolonial Railway since 1898.

Mr. Rogers moved, seconded by Mr. Foster,

That this House do To-morrow, resolve itself into a Committee to consider a certain proposed Resolution respecting consolidation and revisions of the Manitoba Grain Act, Chapter 83 of the Revised Statutes, 1906, and Part II. of the Inspection and Sale Act.

Mr. Rogers, a Member of the King's Privy Council, then acquainted the House, That His Royal Highness the Governor General, having been informed of the subject-matter of this Motion, recommends it to the consideration of the House.

Resolved, That this House will, To-morrow, resolves itself into the said Committee.

Mr. Rogers, a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,—Return (in so far as the Department of the Interior is concerned) of copies of all Orders in Council, plans, papers, and correspondence which are required to be presented to the House of Commons, under a Resolution passed on 20th February, 1882, since the date of the last return, under such Resolution.—(*Sessional Papers, No. 57.*)

And then The House, having continued to sit till twenty minutes after Ten of the Clock, P.M., adjourned till To-morrow.
