Veterans Affairs Mr. Knowles: Question!

Some hon. Members: Question!

Mr. L. A. Mutch (Parliamentary Assistant to the Minister of Veterans Affairs): No, we will not vote on the question at the moment. If one accepts the speeches we have heard on it tonight, to say nothing of the ones we have heard before, at anything approximating their face value, this matter should not be decided in the last three minutes of a long question in which numbers of those on previous veterans' committees, which includes the hon. gentlemen who just called "Question", have been gravely concerned. I am not going to attempt to deal with it in the three minutes that are left, so I ask you, on today's order paper. Mr. Speaker, to call it ten o'clock, and I move the adjournment of the debate. k
