entitled to an equalization payment equal to provinces as a whole. The second table illusthis per capita deficiency.

I do not propose to take the time of the committee to provide a detailed explanation of the mechanics of determining the amount of equalization payable to a province under this formula. This might best be left to the clause by clause committee discussion which will follow second reading of the bill. However, to assist the hon. members to understand the formula, I would like the permission of this committee to place two tables in Hansard. The first table shows the provincial revenues in 16 classes which are to be taken into account; the revenue base associated with each revenue class and, the amount of each revenue base by province and for all are as follows:]
