

is in Ontario, that where you erect a municipality, a village or a town or a city, and they have all the powers thereby conferred, This parliament cannot interfere with them and we never would think of interfering with them. In this case, the clause had better stand as it is, both in the interest of municipalities, and the interests of those who have invested their money in these enterprises.

The clause was allowed to stand.

Hon. Mr. FULFORD, from the committee, reported that they had made some progress with the Bill, and asked leave to sit again.

An Act to incorporate the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway Company is moved, I will move that we insert the words 'Governor in Council' before the words 'as to the location on Lake Superior.' The object is for the government to have control of the terminals on Lake Superior.

Hon. Sir MACKENZIE BOWELL—I thought that proposition was made in committee and rejected.

Hon. Mr. DANDURAND—No.

Hon. Sir MACKENZIE BOWELL—I know the hon. gentleman from Marquette proposed it, but whether he withdrew it or not, I do not remember.

Hon. Mr. DANDURAND—It was not taken into consideration. The hon. gentleman thought it passed with my amendment, but it did not.
