Dear Dean Mackay:-

There is a matter which I have often thought of mentioning to you, but in case I should continue to overlook it I had better mention it to you now.

One of our graduates when visiting in Ottawa recently had some conversation with a Mr. Lynch, a graduate of ours in the Government service. Mr. Lynch stated that when the Dominion Government called for applications for positions for which graduates in Science might be expected to reply he noticed that a great many applications came from Queen's men and scarcely any from McGill. Now this may indicate that McGill graduates are so well placed that they are satisfied with their present positions, or it may mean that Queen's have some organization for bringing these vacancies more readily to the notice of their graduates.
