"After completing a three thousand mile tour of Western Canada, I feel like the discoverer of a new continent—a comtinent which is an agricultural empire, rivaling in possibilities and opportunities those found in the great Mississippi Valley fifty years ago, During the past inree years more than three hundred and fifty thousand farmers from the United States have made the same discovery and have settled in Western Canada,." "In the great stretch of territory lying along the line of the Canadian Northern Railway we saw, and in many causes personally inspected, thousands of acres of wheat, which will yield from twenty to forty bushels to the Acre this season. We saw nearly as many thousands of acres of oats, which will yield, as near as i am able to estimate, from sixty to one hundred bushels per acre. We found heavy crops, rich with promise of big yields, in practically every section of Canada visited.

"Grain-raising, that is to say, wheat raising, will probably remain for a long time to come the chief product of the Canadian farms; nevertheless, I was most favorably impressed with the opportunities open to the man who engages in mixed farming and stock-raising. 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ANCIENT CARVING THIS. Indian Arrow Head Indicated Rapids
In Boise River.

BOISE. Idaho, Sept. 16. Excavators at the Aorrowrock dam of the Payette-Boise project have uncovered the carving of a great arrow head in the side of a gigantic cliff, 90 feet below the surface of the present bed of the Boise River. The arrow head is near what has been the bed of the old river, and those familiar with Indian legend believe it explains the name given by the red men to the dam site.


