— We regret to chronicle a serious accident which befell the Allan steamship *Sardinian* on Friday last, though happily it has not resulted so disastrously as was at first feared. While in M.ville harbor, where she called to take on mails and passengers, an explosion took place of the gas in one of the coal bunkers, and immediately the ship took fire. In order to save her from utter destruction she was scuttled and sunk in 30 feet of water. Subsequent advices are to the effect that she has been successfully raised and will be repaired. Several lives were lost among the crew and steerage passengers and a number of persons were injured. Had the accident occurred at sea the loss of life must have been frightful. The loss falls entirely on the Messrs. Allan, who are their own insurers.
