The humble Memorial of AARON HOGSETT
RESPECTFULLY SHEWETH—

That on the resignation by Captain David Buchan, Royal Navy, of the office of Sheriff of this Colony, which he had held for the last ten years, your Excellency was pleased to appoint memorialist to succeed him, by Commission under the Great Seal of this Island, bearing date the first day of September last.

That your Excellency's memorialist has to his great disappointment and concern, recently learnt from authentic sources, that his Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies has nominated another individual to fill the said office, and therefore most respectfully begs leave to point out to your Excellency the extreme hardship of his case should he be deprived of the said appointment, which he believes your Excellency was pleased to bestow on him in consideration of long and faithful services to his Majesty, as well in this Colony as elsewhere,—a measure which your Excellency will readily suppose to be fraught
