WARM AFFECTS REALTY MARKET

Brokers Are Doing Little, But Land Sellers Are Fairly Active--Review of Present Situation.

Brokers handling down-town properties have practically ceased work and many express the intention to do no more business until the present warm spell is over. They might just as well for no one seems to want to bother about looking at properties just now.

What little buying is going on is on account of interests who must secure property for new buildings or some other equally serious business. The speculative element has died away for the time being and operators find time hanging heavy on their hands. Land for house building is moving quite freely, and the warm weather, while it makes deals slow in maturing, is not seriously affecting business in that line.

The house situation remains unchanged. There are a few more buildings on the market than a month ago, due to the fact that brick has been a little easier to get in the last two weeks and builders are rushing their jobs. Houses are selling before completion as usual, and while the supply will be more varied from now on, the demand is rather restricted. There is far from a surplus of houses in the market, as any one who starts to fall, the demand is rather restricted.

MUST CEASE WORK ON APARTMENT HOUSE

Because a restriction in the deed that says buildings must be erected to face Palmerston-boulevard and that a pair of semi-detached houses must not be built on less than fifty feet, Justice Teetzel has issued an injunction on application of J. B. Holden, preventing Bridge Ryan from erecting an apartment house at the corner of Harbord-street and the boulevard. The structure now up to the first story as planned, will have a dividing wall running thru the middle from cellar to roof, and the judge held this made the building a semi-detached structure.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land. Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother, sister or intestate. The homesteader upon satisfaction of the land in each of the nine miles of his homestead or a minimum of at least 30 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. The homesteader must be a bona fide settler on his homestead. The homesteader must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required for the completion of the patent) and cultivate fifty acres thereof. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$20 per acre, plus realty tax. Realty tax, in each of three years, cumulative fifty dollars and erect a house worth \$200.
