Wheat—The market had a very weak spell the first half of to-day's session, cue to several causes, and selling was very popular, especially by the local trade. The report that over a quarter of a million bushels of wheat had been bought in Du-70th and sold here at a profit, and advices from the seabcard that rains in Argentina had done much benefit, and a revised estimate of The Corn Trade News, reducing the requirements of certain importing countries in Europe to the extent of over 50,000,000 bush, continued to make a very bearish feeling. The offerings were absorbed mainly by outside buying orders in hands of commission houses, the same class of buying which has hitherto come into the market on the breaks. There was also buying by some of the local trade, who have not been in the market for some time. Offerings were very light after the reaction started: price's improved 1½c. Export trade at seaboard was light, but at Toledo two cargoes and at Detroit one cargo soid for shipment cast. The market closed very strong and looks higher.

Provisions—Opened steady to a shade lower, and ruled very dull all day. John Cudahy sold a few lots of Dec. pork. Packers operated in a very small way, selling moderately of Jan. lard. There is not much disposition to sell at prescut prices. The market closed steady. Estimated hogs to morrow, 34,000.

Henry A. King & Co., A king-street east, received the following desp tch to-day from New York:

The stock market was very strong to-day from start to finish. Though London showed a fractional decline this morning, our market opened at an advance over yesterday's closing prices. The early trading showed a slight loss, but very soon the market gathered strength, and under the lead of Manhattan continued strong during the balance of the session, making a considerable gain throughout the entire list. Manhattan was by all odds the strongest feature in the market, although Chicago Gas and the Granger stocks were a very good second. There was no conspicuous buying of Manhattan, but it seemed to be in very good demand to cover snorts, and these purchases forced the price up about \$4 per share. The strength in Chicago thas was more easily explained by the reported final settlement of the recent gas comprications in Chicago. In the Grangers and other railroad stocks, we think the strength is due to the fact that the remarkably
