"Scientific Requirements of a Rational Social System."

He conterded that before the physical could be solved we must solve the metallysical. While we are all more or less blased in our opinions, social reformers must overcome this and get together, as there are enough in Canada to make the existing Governments tremble. The great fundamental axiomatic principle must be discovered, and the great problem of life is to discover the relation of cause to effect. Various reformers, free silverites, an archists, single taxers, socialists and preachers propound cure-alls for the evils of the present economic condition, but in doing so they fail to distinguish between sequence and consequence. Collectivism and individualism are both needed in a true state of society. The speaker also criticized socialists for condemning competition, although we have never had a true competition. All public utilities should be in the hands of the Government, but private property should not be abolished.


