BIG BLAZE AT SUNNYSIDE. The Toronto Rowing Club's Building and All Its Contents Were Destroyed.

TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS DAMAGE. Occupants Had to Jump for Their Lives—Fireman Tomlinson Injured by Falling Debris.

He crossed his father and the other members of the family, but when they rushed to the top of the stairs they found that the way of escape was cut off by the flames. The only other avenue of escape was by the windows, and the five members of the family, one after another, jumped into a large snowbank. Capt. May, who keeps an adjoining tenement house, wrapped them in blankets, and had them removed in a hack to the home of a relative on Spadina.
