RACE SCANDAL AT PIMLICO

Gentleman Jockey is Set Down for Alleged Pulling of My Grace to Allow Homelander to Win—Turf Cossip.

The racing at Pimlico has developed a scandal which is liable to stir up the steeplechase end of the game beyond measure.

Several days ago the Pimlico stewards, H. J. Morris, Frank J. Bryan and William M. Manley, notified Jay O'Brien, the well-known gentleman jockey, that because of his ride on My Grace in the "Bridge Hunters" steeplechase he could not take another mount during the meeting.

This ruling practically closed the door on the gentleman jockey, and as a result he says that unless the reflection on his character is promptly removed he will take the matter before the stewards of the National Steeplechase and Hunt Association.

Mr. O'Brien further declares that he was offered \$200 on My Grace with Sim Delmei, a well-known layer. My Grace was defeated by Homelander, who is said to be one of the best hunters in the country.

Those who are in contact with the affair say that H. J. Morris was the investigator of the stewards' ruling, and that he practised an honest attempt to defeat Homelander. W. C. Hayes, well known, declared that Mr. O'Brien has been unjustly treated, and that he should be exonerated without further delay.

Fifty head of thoroughbred horses for use by the officers of the German army will be shipped from New York to Germany from which point they will sail this week.

All of the horses, which are of the high type thoroughbred, were shipped during the week at Lexington by Herr L. Keller, a representative of the officers of the German army, and Emil Jacobson, an interpreter, of New York.

S. C. Hildreth has arranged for Jockey McCarthy to do his light weight riding next winter at Oakland. McCarthy will go to California at the close of the Pimlico meeting. McCarthy has entered Reid Gaultier in the long-distance stakes to be run at Oakland, and the presumption is that he contemplates a campaign.

A story sent out from Reno to the effect that T. H. Williams is seeking a 25-year-old horse for the purpose of racing it is without foundation in fact. The population of Reno and other nearby places is so small that it is impossible to find anything but an exceedingly limited scale.

Training has been resumed at Oakland. Sewell furnished the star performance by working five furlongs in 1:02 3-5. Considerable interest was shown in the race, which was excellent. Sewell will not start in the Opening Handicap, but will go in the spring purse conditions during the early days of the meeting.

Worked Redgout six furlongs in 1:45 1-2, the first of the season, and he has asked of the horse since his arrival. Several Opening Handicap candidates, including Montgomery, were sent slow miles.
