New Bedford, Mass., Aug. 19.—Dr. Henri S. Peland, former postmaster-general of Canada, who was captured in Begium when the Germans incaded that country, still believes that there is an organized campaign in Canada to rescue him, according to a there is an organized campaign in Canada to rescue him, according to a letter received here tonight. The letter was from a Fronch-Canadiun officer who met on Englishman who had been released from the prison camp where Dr Beland was confined. He said the former Capadian postmaster-general had nearly lost his reason when his wife died some time after their imprisonment, but that he had showed rare courage and had never given up hope of regaining his freedom. The Englishman said that Dr. Beland's hair had not turned white during his confinement, as had been reported, but that his face was drawn and he weighs now only 140 pounds. It is said that much longer confinement would place Dr. Beland's life in jeopardy.

He was wounded in the autumn of 1916, and after treatment in English hospitals for six months returned to the trenches. The news comes now as a great shock to his friends, as no other intimation had been received on what occasion he had been recently wounded. He was unmarried and about 30 years of age.

These are three in number, The first is merely verbal, the second created an appeal tribunal for the Yukon ferritory; the third provided that no conviction for violating the law should be entered without the consent first obtained of the attorney-general of Canada.
