Sir,-

I beg to refer you to your letter of the 28th February 1913, T-66-66, relating to the description proposed to be entered in the patent of the right of way of the Canadian Northern Railway through the townplot of The Pas, Man., and to request you to be good enough to state whether the description referred to in the preceding correspondence is satisfactory to your Company, in order that the patent may be issued.

We have received a complaint from Mr. George A. McLelland, Town Solicitor, The Pas, Man., to the effect that your Company will not allow the streets to be opened across your line. You will note in the description above mentioned that it is proposed to reserve certain street crossings.
