FACTORY SUPERINTENDENT AND RAILWAY MAN WERE VICTIMS AT HAUBERGE

Amsterdam, Nov. 15, via London.—Information was received here today from Brussels to the effect that at a recent court martial at Maubeuge, northern France, Eugene D. Halluin, a factory superintendent, and Achille Doucedan, a former railroad employee, were sentenced to death on the charge of espionage. Five persons, including two women, were sentenced to long terms in prison and many others to short terms, on similar charges.

Fay Tells All

New York, Nov. 15.—Robert Fay, self-styled lieutenant in the German army, and by his own confession head of a gang of bomb makers that sought to destroy munition-laden ships sailing from New York to Allies, told the story of his life today to Assistant United States District Attorney Knox. Fay talked freely, fully and of his own volition for five hours without interruption. What he said was not made public, but at the conclusion of the session Mr. Knox announced that all Fay wanted to do now was to plead guilty to the government's charge against him and go to jail.

GREAT PROGRAMME AT THE IMPERIAL

The Woman a Remarkable Feature—The Goddess—Madame Furlong-Schmidt

It was the Jesse L. Lasky Company who put on Carmen in Imperial Theatre a short time ago and it is perhaps not unfair to state that in the public estimation this producing company has much more to its credit than any of its associates in the Paramount programme. Madame Furlong-Schmidt sang very prettily indeed that popular ballad, My Little Home in the West and for an encore When the Boys Come Marching Home, a rattling good patriotic song.

LYRIC SHOWS ONE OF THE BEST YET

Arrival of Perpetua Excellent Picture—Good Vaudeville

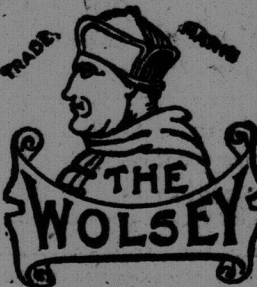
