Youth Saves Them.

Chicago, Sept. 11—(Canadian Press)—Life imprisonment was the punishment fixed today by Judge John R. Caverly upon Nathan Leopold, jr., and Richard Loeb, confessed kidnappera and murderers of 14-year-old Robert Synopsis—The disturbance which was over the Ottawa Valley yesterday has moved a little northward and another has developed on the middle Atlantic coast.
