At the offices of Commissioner Thornton last evening there was a good attendance of the parade committee in



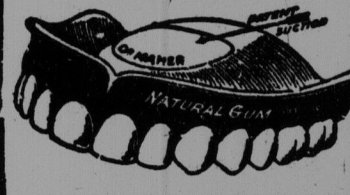

of the Halifax dry dock, informed the Telegraph-Journal last evening. Mr. Brookfield, who is at present connected with the Brookfield Construction Company, Ltd., of Halifax, accompanied by Henry Roper, general manager of the company, were taken out to Courtenay Bay yesterday to inspect the work there. Both these men were intimately connected with the Halifax dockyards, Mr. Brookfield, as general manager for thirteen years previous to the expropriation of the shipyards by the Federal Government, and Mr. Roper, in connection with the construction as the Brookfield Construction Company had a large part in the building of the dock. When asked how it compared with other docks he had seen, Mr. Brookfield said that he had spent six or seven years in Scotland and England, previous to assuming the management of the Halifax dockyards, studying conditions there, and there was no doubt that the claims for the size of this dock were justified. It was admirably equipped, he said, and he felt sure it would fulfill the expectations of those who fathered it, if not the present abnormal times in the shipbuilding industry, at least when shipping got back to a normal basis. Mr. Brookfield and Mr. Roper left last evening for Halifax.

Route Defined.

In addition to floats the motor apparatus of the St. John Fire Department will also be on the parade, and when Kane's Corner is reached the fire apparatus will turn to the left and return to their stations via Marsh Road. It was decided that the different sections, which are to participate in the parade, would assemble at 1:30 o'clock on Monday afternoon and take their positions as directed by the grand marshal, and that the parade start off at 2 o'clock sharp.

The route of procession is as follows: King street east, down Sydney, along Union, Prince Edward, Haymarket Square, Thorne avenue, Red Head road to dry dock. So soon as the parade reaches the dry dock, members of the Salvage Corps companies, with the call band, will go on duty with local police constables in looking after the safety of the large crowd assembled.

The matter of placing the bands in position was discussed, and it was finally decided that representatives of the five musical organizations in the city, St. Mary's, City Cornet, Horn and Bugles, Carleton Cornet, and Pipe Band, meet at Commissioner Thornton's office, Prince William street, St. John, on Monday evening at 8 o'clock for the purpose of drawing for positions. The meeting adjourned until Saturday evening.

"All Set" is the slogan now of the citizens' committee for the opening ceremonies. Final details and reports of the various sub-committees, considered at a meeting in Mayor Fisher's office last evening, showed that the only item now needed to crown the committee's plans with success was some kindly co-operation on the part of the weather authority.

Mr. Thornton's account of the activities of the parade committee was heartily endorsed and clearly indicated that the hard work performed by the members would make the affair one of the finest held in St. John in many years. Com. Thornton took the opportunity of thanking those clubs and citizens who had come forward and assisted the committee in its work.

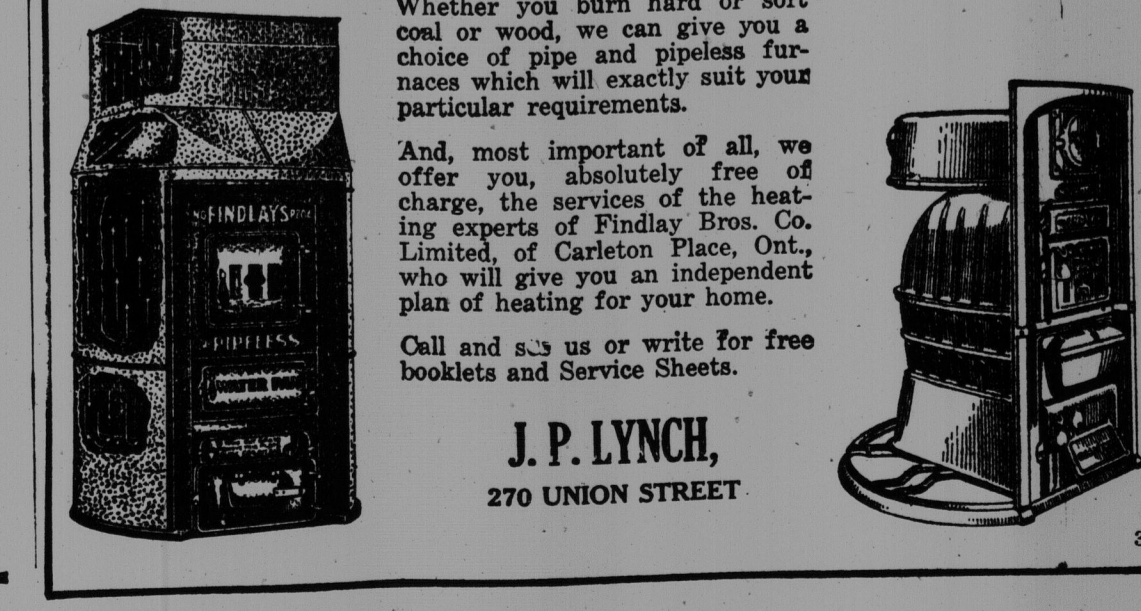
