THE NATIONAL PARK The Times has received a copy of an address delivered in the legislative council of Quebec by Hon. A. 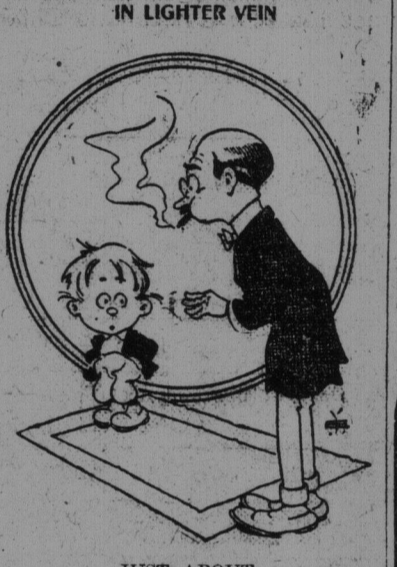
