Washington, Dec. 29—It is expected that the Harding Administration in the next few days will come to a decision regarding the status of the Cuban steamer Miguel Ferrer, which is lying in the harbor at Fernandina, Fla., with a cargo of 5,000 cases of liquor aboard, which, according to the ship's papers, was bound for the fishing village of St. Pierre, off the south coast of Newfoundland.
