Dr. Kowalkski, a leading Austrian army physician, and chief of the Institute of Bacteriology at Vienna, defends the lymph on the ground that it is one of the most powerful medicines discovered, and it cannot be applied to cautiously.

Prof. Koch says if it were placed without reserve in the lhands of all practioners more deaths would result from its use than ever were caused by consumption. The reasons for withbolding Dr. Koch's secret from the unprofessional public and from the unscrupulous professional public are perfectly valid; there is no remedy, no matter how efficacious when skilfully administered, that would not prove a curse in the hands of charlatanism or ignorance.
