"The import of the past week has again been moderate, there being comparatively few arrivals of the principal wood goods, so that the quays show plenty of unoccupied spaces.

"A good and steady demand from the country still continues, the wharves at the various carrying companies' depots, whether by rail or water, being fully occupied with timber and deals waiting transport to the inland towns.
