



THE WHEAT CROP.

LONDON, July 22.—The wheat har-vest commenced in eastern Kent Mon-day morning the tropical heat having rapidly developed the grain. Estimat-ing the wheat prospects, the Mark Lane Express says the wheat will be fine both in quantity and quality on five per cent. of area sown; average of 25 per cent. of area sown will in-evitably produce a short crop. The straw crop will be the smallest since 1888.

In its preliminary trade estimate the Mark Lane Express puts the Russian wheat crop at 58,000,000 quarters, against 56,000,000 in 1890. On this basis the expert surplus should be 18,000,000 quarters.




