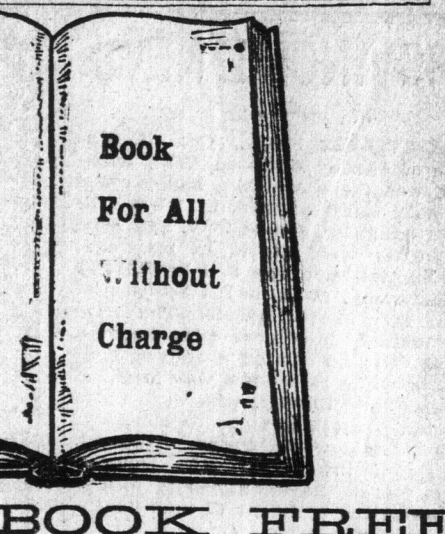
BIG MEETING AT BATH. BATH, Carleton Co., Oct. 25.—One of the largest political meetings ever held in this village was held last evening.
