The Council indorsed the proposition of the Toronto Board, but declined to make to the Government the following recommendation suggested by the Toronto Board, viz.:—

"And it is further recommended that no entry for an amount of over \$100.00 be accepted by the Customs from any broker or other party than the owner of the goods, unless such broker or agent assumes the responsibility of the said entries, and is a responsible party, in case of action being taken by the Government,"

The Council declined to approve of the last named recommendation because it could easily be foreseen that many difficulties would arise when legitimate business was done through the regular Customs Brokers.

## ST. ANDREW'S RAPIDS IMPROVEMENTS.
