## BILL

### An Act to authorize Charles Lockey Beard to practise as a Provincial Land Surveyor,

**W**HEREAS, Charles Lockey Beard, of the City of Hamilton, in the County of Wentworth, in the Province of Canada, Civil Engineer, hath by his Petition to the Legislature represented that he has served from the seventh day of December one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight, to the seventh day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, under articles to James Meadows Rendel, late of the City of London, in that part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called England, Esquire, a Civil Engineer and Surveyor, and late President of the Institution of Civil Engineers in that City, for the purpose of learning and practising that profession, and that during the whole of that period he was constantly employed by and under the said James Meadows Rendel, in surveys and other works connected with the practice of a Civil Engineer and Surveyor in England aforesaid; that he the said Charles Lockey Beard has also been engaged in Canada for some years past in surveys and other works connected with the said profession of a Civil Engineer and Surveyor; and Whereas the said Charles Lockey Beard hath further represented that he has, both before and during the period of his employment and service under Articles, gone through a course of Geometry, and the various other branches of Knowledge specified in the Surveyor's Act for this Province, and is well versed therein, and also in the theory and practice of the said profession of a Civil Engineer and Surveyor, and has produced evidence thereof; and Whereas the said Charles Lockey Beard hath prayed that an Act may be passed enabling him, upon giving the notice required by Law, and upon payment of the proper fees, and giving the necessary security, and taking and subscribing the oaths required, to practise as a Land Surveyor, in and for that part of the Province of Canada which formerly constituted Upper Canada, without being required to comply with any further or other requirements in the several Acts contained;

Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows :

1. It shall be lawful for the Board of Examiners for Upper Canada, established under the Act passed in the Session held in the Twelfth Year of Her Majesty's Reign, Chapter 35, as amended by the Act passed in the Session held in the Fourteenth and Fifteenth Years of Her Majesty's

Board of Examiners for Upper Canada may admit Mr. Beard to practice as a surveyor, on certain conditions.
