HEREAS the Laws herein-after mentioned have, by Experience, been found useful and beneficial; may it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the Bounties granted by an Act, made in the Twenty-sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to amend and render more effectual the several Laws now in Force for encouraging the Fisheries carried on at Newfoundland and Parts adjacent, from Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions in Europe; and for granting Bounties, for a limited Time, on certain Terms and Conditions*, which were to be paid and allowed annually from and after the First Day of January One thousand seven hundred and eighty-seven, for Ten Years and no longer; and all and every Regulation therein contained respecting the same, shall, from and after the First Day of January One thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, be revived, and the same are hereby revived; and the said Bounties shall be paid and allowed, and the said Regulations shall continue in Force, for and during the further Term of Two Years from the said First Day of January One thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven.

II. And be it further enacted, That so much of an Act, made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to amend an Act, passed in the Twenty-seventh Year of His present Majesty's Reign, for allowing the Importation and Exportation of certain Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, in Foreign Ships, into and from certain Ports and Places in the West Indies; and for amending so much of an Act, made in the Thirty-second Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, as relates to permitting the Importation of Sugar into the Bahama and Bermuda Islands in Foreign Ships; and so much of Two Acts, made in the Twenty-eighth and Thirty-first Years of His present Majesty's Reign, as prohibits the Importation of Timber into any Island under the Dominion of His Majesty in the West Indies from any Foreign Colony or Plantation in the West Indies or South America; and so much of the said Act, made in the Twenty-eighth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, as prohibits the Importation of Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, into Nova Scotia or New Brunswick, from any Country belonging to the United States of America, as respects the Port of Saint John's in the Island of Antigua, which was to continue in Force until the Tenth Day of July One thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, shall be, and the same is hereby further continued until the Tenth Day of July One thousand eight hundred and one:*
