MISSISSAUGA — The Peel County board of education is the first Ontario board to set its. 1871 operating budget following the edict from the Minister of Education to slice school expenditures in an effort to curb spiralling inflation.

Peel board chairman, E. F. (Ted) Conover, in announcing the board's \$55, \$61,325 budget said that cuts amounting to \$2,817,810 had been made from the original budget proposed last November of more than \$58 million to effect an average local tax decrease for education across the county by 71 one hundredths of one per cent.


