Sir,—

417,657.

I have read your letter of the 15th. of March last and concluded that it would be prudent, in my opinion, to acquire the land from 250' southerly of the centre line of the C.P.R'y. to the reserve, within section 8, township 7, range 28, as soon as convenient and for the reason that there are now 2 stores on this strip of land and these stores are not now controlable because they are not on the Indian reserve.

If the land again added to the reserve and licences granted to these shopkeepers they would be asked to confine their sales to Indians of only useful articles and keep no trinkets and so called soft drinks to exchange for the earnings of the Indians.

There is no reason at the present time why the extra land at the Peigan siding should be acquired too.
