Mat the Chiefs oll agreed, that they showed not lesten to any individual, that their application shower be to their Agentonly; by whose advice they would be quided. The Chiefs originally names bel. Claus, as their Agent, & the Thing confermed the appointment. That of the Coursel allower to, which was held at the ona. : Da go Villinge, the proceedings were but to paper, I the Downert still forth coming at the Village, when it was agreed, that we individual should interfere in the hora Concerns except their Agent.
