adjourned on April 17th time did not permit the Committee to deal further with the matter.

The House does not re-convene until May 20th and, with a short session in prospect, there is grave concern on the part of those in touch with the situation that, unless a special effort is made in an endeavor to first, obtain unanimity of action and secondly, expeditious treatment of the matter by both the Standing Committee and the House in general, no legislation will be passed during the present session. This will mean tragic disappointment to our blind people who have been buoyed up and led to believe by current press reports that they could expect this much needed assistance during the present year.
