I have your letter of the 1st.
The Unemployment Insurance Bill went through last night
with certain amendments, but none affecting the substance
much.

It proved impossible to hold
all our men to the amendments calling for the application
to be delayed until after the war. This was due to the
fact that a similar Bill was supported by these men in
1935, and they felt that the public might not see the
distinction between the application then and its applica-
tion now. I quite favor the view and the argument you
present and think it not unlikely that the country will
regret the step it has taken at the present time.
