I am in receipt of your letters of the 7th and 8th instant respecting the small-pex epidemic.

In reply I here to inform you that immediate steps should be taken to vaccina a such Indians and young children as have not yet been vaccin ated, or on whom previous operations were not successful. The never the disease appears, the atricken ones should be isoliated and strict quarantime should be astablished. Such care, and assistance as it may be reasible to extend should be given to infected Indians; and on recovery, or in case of death, steps should be taken to disinfect the houses, and all clothing and bedding used by the patients should be buint. Due attention to account should be observed, and vouchers submitted for payment of outlays incurred on account of small-pox should not contain any other items of expenditure but a fact which are strictly in connection with the epidemic.
