The two Robert are away guiding for a couple weeks. Do you beleive it would be a good idea to take them for a while after they get back? I ask you that because I would like to save the logs which are out of the shelter. They are no t in danger yet, but may be they will in July and August. Oliver did not say a word about the wearness he was feeling and the rest he intended to take, I supposed it is over.

The reason of Aurora's "high pressure" was not due only to the unemployment insurance stamps. This spring she made a general house clean up. She worked her music, for she had to play on the beginning of May. This was for the celebration of the 75 years of Sister Marie Josephine, former superior of the school. On top of this was the unemployment stamps. I think she worked a little too much.

Tuesday afternoon we have studied this stamps business togather and the stamps are glued in the books. I beleive that it will work all right. Last week I have had the visit of Mr J.A.Lefebvre, an unemployment insurance officer from Sorel. He gave me & few explications in regard to these stamps and he spent a couple hours with Aurore. She seems to get the thing all right. Her nerves have quieted down very much.

I have to advise you of one thing in regard to the unemployment insurance. On his visit Mr.Lefebvre had order to make inquiry. He wanted to know the names of the pounders since 1941, their salaries and approximate number of days they worked. I told him I had no record in regard to this matter and I refered him to Aurope. If they begin to stir this matter, I don't think we are ready to see the end of it. I told Mr Lefebvre that if he happened to establish what is supposed to be paid to the Insurange since 1941, it would be easy enough to collect the part of the employer, but how was he to collect the part of the employee, These men work with no regular wage revenue or 4rg away from the Reserve. He answered that may be the Department would pay the employee's part too. I want you to be informed of what is going on.
